Ordering a story and sentence level/grammar work.

The Fate of Fausto by Oliver Jeffers

1. To understand and order the story of a picture book

In this lesson, we will explore what fables are and read a modern fable by Oliver Jeffers called the Fate of Fausto. We will consider the themes of the fable and then revise the structure of a story and order sections of the story on a 'story staircase'. [Lesson 1](#)
