
Dosbarth Blodau-

In Dosbarth Afon, we have been learning about the Solemnity of Christ the King. We had a special class worship where we shared the First reading and Gospel. We reflected upon how Christ is both Shepherd and King and read the words of Pope Benedict XVI when he spoke about Christ's power as King. We shared Psalm 23 through lectio divina (meditative prayer) and then passed around a beautiful crown and said a personal prayer of thanks for the past liturgical year and told God of our hopes for the coming new liturgical year.

We have also been very lucky to have been swimming for a whole fortnight! We have all made amazing progress and have had such fun. We'd like to say a big thank you to Miss Holder for organising it and to Halo for teaching us to be super swimmers and how to be safe in the water. Last Thursday, we had a visit from David Brin, a CAFOD representative who came to teach us all about Catholic Social Teaching. We Brightened Up by wearing our favourite colours and raised money to support CAFOD in their very important work. We were lucky enough to have a workshop with Mr Brin who helped us learn about the Catholic Social Teaching principles and how to live the Gospel in today's world. We learned about Pope Francis' encyclical letters called Fratelli Tutti and Laudato Si and how we need to put our faith into action which we feel very strongly about. Today we had a bit of a surprise when Bob the Elf turned up in our classroom! He hasn't made a very good start in Dosbarth Afon as he scribbled on the whiteboards and tipped all our Christmas tree decorations all over the table! Dosbarth Coed-

Dosbarth Coed have been working hard and having lots of fun in their learning during the past fortnight. We have continued our work as 'mini monarchs' in our Tudor and Stuart topic and have researched some of the mightiest monarchs of Tudor and Stuart times by watching videos, listening to information online and reading research notes. We are still unsure who the mightiest monarch is so we will have to carry on with our research over the next few weeks. We have also enjoyed being critical, creative, collaborative and caring thinkers during our P4C sessions. During

one session, we focused on our virtues of being discerning and attentive and thought about the question "Am I always responsible for my actions?" We talked about this in class, shared our opinions and built upon each other's ideas. We have also completed some more French outdoor learning tasks. We have been on a Winter scavenger hunt: 'Chasse au trésor d'Hiver,' learnt a French song about the different parts of the body and labelled chalk drawings using this new vocabulary. During our literacy sessions we have worked hard on our newspaper report writing and we are now ready to write our own news report, based on the protagonist of our class reader 'Spy Master!'
