### Dosbarth Haul-

We finished our RE topic Good News this fortnight by thinking about how the Holy Spirit makes us feel. We listened to the story Teddy Horsley's Windy Day to help us understand that even though we can't feel, see or hear the Holy Spirit we know it's around us making us feel safe, loved and happy. We then made wind spinners decorated with Pentecost colours and added a word to describe how the Holy spirit makes us feel. We had a lovely class worship celebrating and remembering all we have learned about our topic.



### Dosbarth Enfys-

Dosbarth Enfys have started exploring time this week. We explored duration and how long it takes to do different activities in seconds, minutes and hours. We extended our learning even further by thinking about days, months and years! We have continued our traditional tale work and in our groups re-told the story of Jack and the Beanstalk. We then linked our learning into our P4C sessions where we had a really good discussion about whether Jack was a goodie or a baddie. We were a bit undecided but we practised using our Caring Cwtch to listen to others' opinions.



### Dosbarth Blodau-

We've had an exciting week in Blodau carrying out some more challenges and tasks for our client Barti Ddu. We really put our skills to the test when we were sent a telling the time problem solving activity. We are all now working hard telling the time to the hour, half past and quarter times on analogue and digital clocks. We had to scan QR codes hidden around our classroom which gave us different times pirates visited different features on a map. We had to put the times in order to help Barti Ddu plan his route around the island.

This week we've really enjoyed using a range of materials creatively to develop our techniques in the different art forms. We looked at the work of J.M.W. Turner and explored the seascapes that he created. We noticed the colours he used really portrayed stormy seas! So, we decided to make our own stormy seascapes, we have worked hard to create beautiful collages of a sailing ship on a stormy sea. We even added a sprinkling of salt to the blue and green watercolour shades to add texture to the sea water because we always comment on how the sea tastes salty!



### Dosbarth Seren-

In Dosbarth Seren we have been very busy this past fortnight. We have completed lots of lovely learning related to our topic, Ancient Greece. We have learnt about Alexander the Great and created a fact file upon him, we debated whether he was a good or bad person after discovering what he achieved through his reign. Also, we have designed our very own Ancient Greek vases. Our vases all told a unique story that we each personally created based upon our knowledge of Ancient Greek civilisation. We have also looked at Greek Gods and Goddesses and begun to understand how Ancient Greeks believed in them and the reasons behind their beliefs. During our maths sessions, we built upon our understanding of telling the time and learnt about money too. We have enjoyed classifying animals during our science lessons. We very much enjoyed our trip to Life Exhibition in the Gospel Hall, Bridgend. We learnt more about Jesus' life and how his life impacted on the lives of his disciples. In PE, we have been further developing our athletic skills, linking our learning to the Olympics, and we have been understanding how to jump for distance. ### Dosbarth Afon-

In Dosbarth Afon, we have been really busy with our commission and learner forum for our client, Sir Clive Alderton, the Private Secretary to King Charles III. We have worked hard exploring our enquiry question - What makes a good King? We have looked back through history at the two previous King Charles - I and II. We have seen how Charles II learnt from the mistakes his father Charles I made and the promises he made to the people in the Declaration of Breda. We were asked to create a biography about King Charles III by our client and to present it using out ICT skills. We researched Charles' life and looked to the future to predict if we think he will make a good King after the solemn vows and promises he made at his coronation. We all agreed that he will make an excellent monarch due to the good example that his mother, Queen Elizabeth II, set and because of all the good work he has done over the years in his role as the Prince of Wales. After we presented our commissions we celebrated with a coronation party.





### Dosbarth Coed-

It has been a busy half term so far for Dosbarth Coed! We have continued to learn about climate change and global warming in our new topic, Global Goals and enjoyed reading factual information about these issues and creating questions for our partners to answer. When reading the story of 'The Great Kapok Tree,' during Literacy lessons, we have also learnt about the rainforests, some of the animals that live there and the dangers they face due to deforestation. We will be using this text to inspire our narrative poems later this term. In science we have drawn line graphs to present thermal insulator investigation results and reflected on our findings. We have also learnt more about the Holy Spirit transforming and shaping lives through carrying out many RE tasks based on

scripture readings, through discussions and through drama/role play and we have been curious outdoor learners, searching for signs of Spring in the super grounds. Last week we also had great fun celebrating the upcoming coronation through completing coronation tasks in class and we also had our very own class coronation party!



### Dosbarth Mynydd-

Dosbarth Mynydd have been working hard over the last fortnight. In our games sessions, we have been practising our skills of passing and defending within the game of rugby. Our P4C sessions have linked to our virtue pair, Active and Curious. We are being curious about our beautiful outdoor area and this week have talked about what is beauty, finding examples in our local area. In English, we have started exploring spooky stories and have really enjoyed reading an anthology of spooky stories entitled Short by Kevin Crossley-Holland. We are very excited to write our own spooky stories over the next fortnight! Finally in our topic, Make your Voice Heard!, we have been finding out about people who have stood up for the rights of others including; St Oscar Romero, Owain Glyndwr and the suffragettes. We will be using these people as influences for our artwork, which we will share with you soon!
