It has been a fantastic start to the year for Dosbarth Seren! Over the past fortnight, Dosbarth Seren have been very busy settling into their new class. During our outdoor PE sessions, we have been learning how to effectively collaborate as a team and what characteristics we need to be a good team member. We are learning about 'What is the Church?' in RE and learning how the people of the church come together as the body of Christ. We have been busy developing our mathematical skills and recognising place value. We very much enjoyed meeting our client Will, Lord of the Stone Age, who sent us a mysterious letter and some clues linked to our new topic. We have begun to explore our topic 'Rocks and Fossils', looking at some facts about the Stone Age. Many of the children have enjoyed bringing in rocks they have found in nature and sharing them with the class, we have also had some fossils brought in too! We have been making the most of the sunshine and enjoying outdoor learning. We looked at the work of artist Andy Goldsworthy and used his work which inspired us to create structures using natural resources. We have also began classifying rocks and grouping them in our science lesson. What a busy few days we've had and a wonderful start to the new school year- well done everyone, keep up the great work!

Dosbarth Afon have had a very successful start to the new academic year and have settled in very quickly. We were a little sad to say 'Hwyl fawr' to Brianne who has moved but very excited to welcome Daniel and Ethan as new members of our class. We have also started our learning in Science and have been learning about the different states of matter - solids, liquids and gases. We had great fun learning about how the particles behave in the different states of matter by becoming particles and moving around.

During the last fortnight we have started working on our new topic, 'The Ancient Maya Civilization,' which focuses on the history and geography of the ancient Maya. For this we will need to research the Ancient Maya and produce leaflets, videos and art work to showcase our knowledge. We have also started to learn more about place value in maths and we have begun some RE work, learning about Vatican II and what the different parts of a church are. We have worked hard on handwriting in Literacy and are really enjoying our new class reader, The Snow Spider! We have also managed to fit in some PE and play Welsh quizzes on the ipads... what a busy start to the year! We are looking forward to lots more learning and fun in class!

We have had a fabulous start to the school year in Dosbarth Mynydd! We have started our new topic, Blowin' in the Wind with a visit to Cenin Renewables at Parc Stormy. We attended a workshop on climate change, looked at the wind turbines and solar panels and visited the eco house. We also met the client for our topic, Jo, who has given us our final commission – to design and make a model of an eco-friendly house! We have also used our numeracy skills to explore climate data and used this as inspiration to create some artwork using powder paints. Dosbarth Mynydd- Oliver and Charlie for being so polite in class and offering to help staff members.





BCBC Pupil Attendance Focus

On Monday 18th September all schools throughout Bridgend County Borough will promote the importance of school attendance and punctuality as part of a BCBC 'Attendance Launch'. All schools will participate in a range of activities with a focus on improving attendance and punctuality. As part of this launch, there will be a multi-agency approach where learners who are not in school with an unexplained absence, i.e., you have not notified the school why your child is not in school, may receive a visit from partner agencies, including Early Help and Education Welfare Service.

Parental Questionnaire Findings

I would like to thank all those parents that took their time to complete the questionnaire and here are the main findings and how we are going to address the areas to develop:

Areas of Success

- We were thrilled with how positive many of the responses were. It's great that nearly every statement on the questionnaire was agreed with.
- 20 questions scored a 100% agreed response. We are especially thrilled to see this for statements
 like 'The school reflects the ethos and practices of a Catholic School', 'The school is welcoming'
 and 'The school caters well for the individual needs of my child and where appropriate my child
 receives the additional support that they need.'
- 100% of parents agreed that the teaching in St Robert's was good and that staff expect children
 to work hard and achieve their best. We are constantly monitoring the teaching and learning in
 our school, to ensure that it is to a good standard.
- 100% of parents feel that overall the school promotes good behaviour and that the behaviour of children in the school is good.
- 100% of responses agreed with the statement 'The school helps my child to become more mature
 and take on responsibility'. This is especially pleasing to see as a whole school focus this year has
 been on developing pupils' independence.
- There were a number of highly positive comments from parents thank you for these!
