#### Dosbarth Haul-

We've been busy with our Design and Technology project relating to our weather topic. Our client Weather Monkey wanted to make a book with rainbow salad recipes in and needed help to think of different fruits and vegetables that could be used for the different colours. Once we had thought of some great foods we each designed a rainbow salad, help chop the food and put the salad in a rainbow shape in the right order. We then got to eat our salads up - they were so delicious and very healthy!!



#### Dosbarth Enfys-

Dosbarth Enfys have been learning all about animals these past few weeks. We have been classifying animals into different groups by what type of animal they are, what they eat and where they live and have learnt lots of new fantastic vocabulary to describe these animals. We have finished off our literacy unit by writing a fact file all about alligators to go on our writing wall! We were fact investigators on Monday and learnt all about where alligators come from, the type of habitat they like to live in, what they eat and how long they are. Did you know that an American alligator can grow between 3-5 metres long?! Da iawn pawb, you've loved this topic and produced some brilliant pieces of work.



#### Dosbarth Blodau-

We've had an exciting week in Dosbarth Blodau. We've been developing our science and technology skills and have completed our design and technology unit of work and our final commission for our client, Iggy Peck Architect.

We have enjoyed using all of our science knowledge we have learned this half term to complete the final challenge for Iggy Peck in our outdoor learning session. We built bridges using natural things from our super grounds to build the bridges and performed simple tests to see whether they can hold weight. There are lots of budding architects in Blodau!

This week we also decided that we would like to make the 'big bad' character from our story writing work this week, where we have written our own alternative version to the traditional tale of the Three Little Pigs and the Big Bad Wolf.

We have been busy identifying the correct terms for levers, linkages and pivots and looked for these mechanisms around our school. We have created functional linkages that produce the desired input and output motions and have investigated the most suitable card to help us make a moving character.

We have thought carefully about a design criterion of things that we must remember and include when making our moving character. We created two designs of our characters and evaluated our designs against the design criteria, using this information and the feedback from others in the class to help us choose our best design.

We are going to making our final designs in our class learner forum with our families on Thursday afternoon. We are very excited to share our learning from this half term with our families!



#### Dosbarth Seren-

It has been a super busy time in Dosbarth Seren! We all thoroughly enjoyed our activities during Children's Mental Health Week and Safer Internet Day. We talked about making connections, and who we can talk to if we have any worries, both at home and at school. We also ended every day with a song and dance, which was great fun! On Safer Internet Day, we looked at scenarios based upon gaming and group chats, we discussed what we would do in those particular situations. Also, we had to answer questions with 'Tech or No Tech?', identifying whether in certain situation it's easier to use technology or not, helping us to become ethical and informed digital citizens. On Wednesday, we had our learner forum Roman Day and what a brilliant day it was! We started off with a Roman Solider boot camp delivered by St.Fagan's, where we marched like soldiers and explored Roman armour with a real Roman Solider!! We really enjoyed inviting the parents in to join in with our learning. We created beautiful Roman shields, incorporating learning that we gained over the topic, enjoyed a quiz, that recapped our learning and performed some Roman marching. We have had a great half term together Dosbarth Seren, enjoy your week off!



#### Dosbarth Afon-

In Dosbarth Afon, we have been so busy having fun while learning! We have been refining our passing skills in Basketball by playing 1V4 Piggy in the Middle. We have really enjoyed exploring shades and tints in Art. We applied these skills to our topic work and when we expressed ourselves on our Wellbeing Day. For Safer internet Day, we reflected on the positive uses of the internet and what we love about being online by creating an Alpha-Net, thinking of all things internet related that we enjoy. We have responded to our client's commission in our topic by making carbon footprint pledges for home and school and have spread the message of finding local solutions to the global problem of climate change on social media. We are also very excited about our celebrations for St David's Day and have been practising our Jac-y-do Welsh Folk

dance, singing our Welsh parody of We Will Rock You and participating in our Eisteddfod competitions. Phew!




#### Dosbarth Coed-




#### Dosbarth Mynydd-
