What a fantastic start to the year Dosbarth Seren have had! Over the past fortnight, Dosbarth Seren have been very busy. During our outdoor PE sessions, we have been learning how to effectively collaborate as a team and what characteristics we need to be a good team member. In our indoor PE sessions, we have been becoming 'wild animals' by exploring dance and moving our bodies to music and using expressions. Our topic in RE is 'homes', we have been discussing what makes a house a home. In P4C we made a 'compassion-o-meter' and ranked what things were most to least important when demonstrating compassion. We have been busy developing our mathematical skills and recognising place value. We have very much enjoyed meeting our client Indiana Jones and beginning to explore our topic 'Rocks and Fossils'. Many of the children have enjoyed bringing in rocks they have found in nature and sharing them with the class. We have also began classifying rocks and grouping them. What a busy fortnight we've had- well done everyone, keep up the great work!

Dosbarth Afon have had a very successful start to the new academic year. We have received an email from our client, Joann Fletcher, who is a famous archaeologist and Egyptologist asking us to help her find the lost tombs of the Pharaohs by becoming Junior Egyptologists. We have planned out our enquiry and have started work on exploring the world of ancient Egypt by reading our Class reader - The Secrets of the Sun King by Emma Carroll, composing Egyptian music and studying hieroglyphics. We will be working on an archaeological dig site in the woodlands next week and will let you know what we discover. We have also started to find out about the organs of the human body as we will need to learn about the process of mummification. We began by researching the digestive system and tracked the journey of our food which was very enlightening! We have also been swimming this week and have already made excellent progress and are loving every minute of it. We have focussed on Queen Elizabeth II in our worships this week and have prayed for her eternal rest and thought about how she was compassionate and loving by serving our country.



### Dosbarth Coed-

Dosbarth Coed have made a fantastic start to year 5! They have had to get used to being part of a new class, working in a new classroom and having a new teacher! During the last fortnight we have started working on our new topic- In the beginning - which focuses on the history and geography of Bridgend, our local community and Wales and how this has changed over time. We started our topic by using pupil voice to create a KWL grid, full of information we already know about Bridgend and questions which we would like to research and find answers to. In R.E, as part of our topic 'Ourselves,' we have been learning about qualities and talents and have written some beautiful poetry about the qualities and talents we have in our class! We have also started to learn more about place value in maths, forces in science, answered comprehension questions in reading sessions and have worked on our Welsh oracy skills by talking about our hobbies and what we like to do in our free time. In addition to this we have also been swimming this week... a very busy start to the term indeed! We are looking forward to lots more learning and fun in class!











### Dosbarth Mynydd-

We have had a great start to the academic year in Dosbarth Mynydd! We have all settled very well into our final year at St Robert's and have been working very hard. As well as practising our handwriting and develop our knowledge of place value in Maths, we have also started our new class topic entitled, Desert Kingdom. Our client is the BBC natural History Unit and we have taken on the role of TV researchers, finding out about life in the desert and how this is changing due to climate change. Already, we have learnt about what a desert is, where cold and hot deserts are found and created climate graphs in Microsoft Excel. We have also been learning outdoors, exploring different soils in our locality and testing their pH levels.

The St Robert's School Pupil Profile is made up of pairs of virtues or qualities we aspire to grow in, to be the person God wants us to be.


Each half term we will explore a different pair of virtues.

**Dosbarth Coed-** Charlie for his compassionate, kind nature and for always considering how others are feeling.


Freya L-D for showing kind words and actions in class and when playing outside.

### Areas of Success

- 20 questions scored a 100% agreed response. We are especially thrilled to see this for statements

  and 'Staff expect my child to work hard and to achieve his/her best'.
- 100% of parents agreed that the teaching is St Robert's was good. We are constantly monitoring
  the teaching and learning in our school, to ensure that it is to a good standard.

- 100% of parents feel that overall the school promotes good behaviour and that the behaviour of children in the school is good.
- There were a number of highly positive comments from parents thank you for these!
