We've planned things we would like to find out about the oceans and seas and all about pirates. We've made a great start by exploring how many oceans there are and we now know the difference between a sea and an ocean. We've really enjoyed making mini pirate ships, using compass directions to direct our ship around the water tray and exploring the use of sails on a ship.

This week we've really enjoyed our outdoor learning session. We were great at identifying the different types of trees around our super grounds by looking closely at their leaves. Then we classified these by colour, shape and size. We reminded ourselves of the difference between natural and man-made objects and after looking at the great work of artist Andy Goldsworthy we used natural materials to make a picture.

What a fantastic start to Summer Term we have had in Dosbarth Seren! We are all very enthusiastic towards our new topic Ancient Greece and have spent some time thinking about what we would like to learn. We have been learning about Aesop's fables and discovered how there were many stories about mythical beasts in Ancient Greece! We have made the most of the dry and sunny weather (when we can!) and have enjoyed outdoor learning lessons based upon literacy. We created mythical creatures, decorated with natural objects. We discussed how the creatures were feeling and what emotions they were displaying. We then made up a story to go with our creations. We have learnt about our new topic Ancient Greece and met our client Hercules. We have begun to learn some facts about Ancient Greece and what it would be like to live in various city states. We have very much enjoyed our new science topic Plants and Animals. We have begun classifying animals by their features. We have learnt about what things are essential for plants and animals to thrive and survive. In maths we have been learning about money and how to add and subtract amounts and find change. This involved a lot of problem solving. In RE, we have been learning about Jesus' ascension and Pentecost. We have discussed how we, as Jesus' disciples, are energised by His Word and will continue to live out Jesus' mission. What a lovely time we have had and a busy few weeks we have planned!

Dosbarth Coed-


