Holy Week

The week between Palm Sunday and Easter Sunday, Holy Week, is the most sacred time of year. During this special time, we enter into the passion of Christ, his crucifixion, death and resurrection. While the season of Lent is a very important time in the Church, it is helpful to remember that our Lenten practices (prayer, fasting and almsgiving) are meant as preparation for the three days of the Triduum. The Triduum begins at dusk on Holy Thursday and continues through dusk on Easter Sunday.

A Holy Week Prayer

Dear God,

As we enter Holy Week, turn our hearts again to Jerusalem, and to the life, death and resurrection of Jesus. Give us joy in our hearts as we shout Hosanna, welcoming Jesus our King with palms, celebrating all that we hope for as the Easter story unfolds.

Then, as the story of Jesus turns to Good Friday, help us know that you are with us when celebration turns to sadness.

Give us the faith we need to follow you on the way of the cross, which leads to life.

Family Holy Week Reflections

Palm Sunday; Reading John Ch. 12

So they took branches of palm trees and went out to meet him, crying out, "Hosanna! Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord, even the King of Israel!"

On Palm Sunday we remember that Jesus entered Jerusalem on a donkey, with crowds of people welcoming him with palms. They shouted 'Hosanna!', acknowledging God's saving presence. Yet the moment of joy did not last. Jesus had travelled to Jerusalem before,



but this would be his last time. He would be betrayed, tried as a criminal, and executed in the Roman way: death by crucifixion.

Family Activity: Find a palm-like branch in your garden. Place it at your sacred space.

Thursday of Holy Week - Maundy Thursday; Reading John Ch.13

"A new commandment I give to you, that you love one another: just as I have loved you, you also are to love one another."

This reading describes the Last Supper, Jesus praying in Gethsemane, the arrest and trial.

Imagine yourself in each scene, maybe as a disciple, maybe trying to understand the hostility in those who arrest Jesus, and try and understand the strength, character and love in Jesus who suffers this ordeal.

Family Activity: Talk about how Jesus is really present in Holy Communion and how sharing in his body strengthens us to become the Body of Christ and to follow him each day.

Good Friday - Reading Matthew 27: 11-61

"It is finished." And bowing his head, he handed over the spirit. Matthew describes many scenes, events across the first Good Friday. Good Friday is a sombre remembrance of Jesus' crucifixion and death on the cross. It is a day of fasting and penance and a time to examine all of the places in our lives where we fail to follow Christ and fall into sin.

Family Activity: Pray the Lord's Prayer at bedtime on this night in remembrance for Christ's gift of salvation to all.



Holy Saturday- Reading Matthew 27

"So Joseph took the body and wrapped it in a clean linen cloth and laid it in his own new tomb, which he had hewn in the rock. He then rolled a great stone to the door of the tomb and went away."

After all the detail of the last two days, there is not so much to say today. Jesus is dead, his body in a tomb; the authorities seal the tomb, lest someone steal the body. This is not a sort-of death, or a pretend death. 'Jesus died and was buried', as our Creeds succinctly put it.

The disciples observe the Sabbath as best they can, in shock and disbelief. Family Faith Activity: Talk together of a time when you were waiting for an event or special occasion. Describe your feelings of expectancy. Easter Saturday is a time of anticipation- draw a cross and cover it in flowers to show how our feeling of sadness fading away to the excitement of the resurrection and the hope it brings.



Easter Sunday - The Day of Resurrection - Reading Luke Ch.24


"He is not here: he has risen!"

The most important first day of the Church's year. But it begins quietly. As the dawn breaks and lights come

back to the world, two women go to the tomb. They went to mourn and maybe to complete the burial ceremonies which had not been done on Friday evening. In the quiet of the dawn, Jesus meets the grieving women and tells them to go and tell others.

In God's plan, it is for us to spread this good news. There is still freedom for people to accept it or reject it.

Family Activity: Take a walk around your local community looking for signs of new life in springtime. Talk about how Jesus rising to new life is brings us new life with Him.



Thank you God for the joy and wonder of Easter Sunday: that Jesus is risen from the dead! What an amazing thing to have happened!

Be with us as we celebrate on this wonderful day.
