What's been happening in our classes...Beth sy'n digwydd yn ein dosbarthiadau Dosbarth Haul-

Our client Percy wanted us to help the animals in our woodland area in the winter season, like he does, by making hibernation boxes. We decided where the door and air vents should go and then collected natural materials to put inside to make them warm and cosy. Next, we tested different materials to find out which ones were waterproof so we could cover the boxes to stop them getting wet in the rain. In our groups we decided which waterproof material to use, covered our boxes with it and used leaves and twigs to help the box blend into the area. Our last job was to find a quiet and safe place to put the boxes so any animals could use it to sleep in or store food. Some great park rangers in the making!



Dosbarth Enfys-

Dosbarth Enfys have been continuing our good work learning all about animals. We have done some beautiful artwork trying to replicate animal camouflage and got quite messy using oil paints and rollers to print animal footprints! We have been great scientists and have learnt how to classify animals by what they eat, their habitat and what type of animal they are. We were really helped with this by a visit from Chris at Bridgend Reptile Centre who brought in a wonderful collection of reptiles for us to learn about! We have finished off this half term by performing our Loving and Compassionate Gweddiwn with Dosbarth Haul for the whole school and told the story of Noah's Ark whilst learning how we can be loving and compassionate like Jesus. Dosbarth Blodau-

We've been super scientists in Blodau the past few weeks. We have been working hard doing lots of learning and discovering for our Client Ada Twist, Scientist.

We have spent time thinking about how materials cost money to make and so it is important that we use them in a sustainable way. We have been trying really hard in class to think carefully about our rubbish and making good use of our new recycling bins at school. In our outdoor learning we reused toilet roll tubes to make help us make bird cookies and have placed them around our outdoor learning area.

We have really enjoyed exploring waterproofing materials and learned about Charles Macintosh and his famous discovery of how materials can be waterproofed.

We have learned about the force of friction and were excited in our investigation to find out that the smoother the surface the less friction and so objects travelled fastest and furthest on this type of surface. We were super at using our new scientific vocabulary and brilliant at measuring the distance the car travelled on each surface.


We loved carrying out experiments to investigate if materials can be changed. We discovered some materials can be stretched, bent, squashed and twisted, we thought carefully about how this helps to make materials suitable for their uses.

We also discovered that materials can be changed by heating them. We really enjoyed carrying out an investigation to see what happens to chocolate when we melted it. We explored how heating

chocolate changed its state and observed how the chocolate lost its shape and became shiny and glossy.

We have also completed our final commission for Ada Twist by making paper plate hovercrafts and we have written a set of instructions for others of how to make a paper plate hovercraft.





Dosbarth Seren-

What a lovely couple of weeks we have had in Dosbarth Seren! We visited Techniquest and had a really wonderful day, we visited the planetarium, and enjoyed trying all the different investigation stations. The behaviour was excellent and Dosbarth Seren were a true credit to our school. We really enjoyed our science colourful shadows experiment, it was great fun! We used torches covered with translucent paper to see if it affected the amount of shadows that appeared. We thoroughly enjoyed our activities based on children's mental health week and safer internet day. We looked at circles of control, and things we can control, what we can influence and we can't control. We have also been writing diary entries imagining we were our client, Phileas Fogg, travelling around the World in eighty days! We filmed our documentary based upon our topic What A Wonderful World and explained what we enjoyed learning. We will be sharing this documentary with our grown-ups very soon! We have thoroughly enjoyed our geography-based topic and travelling all around the World in this fascinating topic!! Today, we have enjoyed fruit kebabs after we explored where fruit comes from. Dosbarth Afon-

Dosbarth Afon, have been super scientists when investigating our enquiry question - which drinks cause tooth decay? We used eggs to test different drinks because egg shell has similar properties to tooth enamel. We found out that acidic drinks like fruit juices and full sugar fizzy drinks were the worst and that water was the best. We noticed that although milk has calcium in it which is good for our teeth and bones, it contains lactose which is a sugar. As the lactose sugar is broken down, acid is produced that causes your teeth to decay. We now realise how important it is to brush

our teeth twice a day and to limit sugary and acidic drinks. We enjoyed French Friday where we found out about the French artist Seurat and did paintings using his style which is called Pointillism. We had a lovely pupil led class worship last week which was linked to our virtues of Compassionate and Loving. In English, we have had great fun writing detailed descriptions of dragons from our class reader using expanded noun phrases. This was Bailey's idea and he brought in his dragon figures for us to use to help with our writing. We have worked our socks off this half term and looking forward to a rest!



Dosbarth Coed-

Dosbarth Coed really enjoyed the conclusion to their Tudor topic! They played and recorded Tudor fanfares as part of their final commission. Coed have learnt a little about reading music and how to play in time during music sessions as well as how to appraise and evaluate a piece of music. Coed also completed other Tudor based activities such as Tudor games in the hall and lots of drama tasks. We have really enjoyed learning about the Tudors and Stuarts and when writing persuasive writing texts we all thought Henry VIII was the mightiest monarch! This week, we have also completed a launch day focusing on our new topic of 'Ocean Endangered.' During our launch day we used our DCF skills and learnt all about artificial intelligence and how it can help us save and clean the oceans! We are really looking forward to learning more about marine life and our global ocean. We have also been busy learning about ecosystems, biodiversity and food chains in science and have practised Welsh folk dancing ready for our Eisteddfod which will be held after the half term.



Dosbarth Mynydd-

Dosbarth Mynydd have started a new topic in class called Frozen Kingdom. This topic will be focusing on cold regions of the world and how climate change is impacting on the people and animals living there. As part of our launch day we had a virtual chat with Ben Weber, who in the last year visited both the Arctic Circle and Antarctica. He shared lots of pictures and videos with us about his expeditions – it was fascinating! We did lots of activities linked to our new topic including mapping cold regions throughout the world, using our Maths to make symmetrical snowflakes and testing foil boats using marbles! We have also been focusing on poetry at the moment, in readiness for the Bard competition on St David's Day. We have been writing poems in class and using the outdoors to explore the famous Edward Lear poem, The Owl and The Pussycat. We made clay owl sculptures using natural materials as decorations!




School News: Newyddion Ysgol
