What's been happening in our classes...... Beth sy'n digwydd yn ein dosbarthiadau Dosbarth Haul-

This fortnight we've been exploring with our senses. Nursery pupils have been doing lots of activities using their senses - going for a sound walk, collecting natural materials to make 'Nature's perfume', using the feely tubs to describe how things feel, playing Kim's game and saying which tastes they like and dislike.

Reception pupils had great recall of their senses work from nursery and could remember the parts of the body we use our senses for. They enjoyed the challenge of sorting salty and sugary food and finished the topic by having a great P4C session on deciding which sense was the most important and thought about what it would be like to not have a certain sense.

Dosbarth Enfys have had a lovely last week before half term. On Friday we visited St. Fagan's and had a wonderful time looking at all of the different types of houses from the past. We have been learning lots about houses this year so far but it was great to put our learning into practice. In Dosbarth Blodau we have been busy developing our ICT skills this week.

We've been sharing and exploring some more stories by Ed Vere. A big favourite is 'Bedtime for Monsters'. We've loved writing our own versions of the story in our literacy lessons.

In our ICT sessions, we started by taking photographs of the monster characters we've created.

We then typed sentences to describe them and used some super adjectives in our work.

We decided that we would like to make an animation of our own 'Bedtime for Monsters' story. We thought carefully about what we mean by animation. We used JIT to edit and organise multimedia components of text and images to create our animation.

Dosbarth Seren-

This fortnight, we have been very busy in Dosbarth Seren! On Tuesday, we had a wonderful enrichment Stone Age Day that we all thoroughly enjoyed, on this day we celebrated all we had learnt during our topic Rocks and Fossils. We created prehistoric art, looked at how the Stone Age people survived and really gained a better understanding of what it would be like to live during the Stone Age! We created Stone Age jewellery, created cave art, investigated different weapons and tools, and explored the Super Grounds like hunter-gatherers. It was a really lovely enrichment day which celebrated a topic that we have all enjoyed. Many thanks to our families for your support- the children all looked fantastic! In other areas of learning and experience, we have explored ballads, used column method and begun writing narratives based upon our class reader, to name a few! This

half term we have thoroughly enjoyed our tennis lessons with coach Mark. We have had a great first half term and the children have all worked very hard. Da iawn Dosbarth Seren - fantastic work and a great start to Year Three!



Dosbarth Afon-

In Dosbarth Afon, we have been working hard on our first action for the CAFOD 'Live Simply' Award by leading whole school worship for Harvest. The St Bob's COGs challenged us to open our eyes to the needy and gave us some scripture to reflect upon. We read Matthew 25:31-46 and unlocked the scripture, thinking about what Jesus was teaching us and what it means in our lives today. The key verse we focussed on was:

"Whatsoever you did for the least of these brothers and sisters of mine, you did it for me." We researched food insecurity in our area and would like to share some of the information we found with you.

- A quarter of the people in our area live below the poverty line and often don't have enough to eat. That's equivalent to 6 people in our class.
- More than 11.3 million people in Britain live in households that struggle to put enough food on the table.

- Over 5 million people regularly go a whole day without eating in the UK.
- August 2020 saw the United Nations agency UNICEF begin to fund charities helping to feed hungry UK children for the first time in its history.
- Foodbanks gave 3 million three-day emergency food supplies to people in crisis in 2022. That has more than doubled since 2017 and is half a million more than the previous year.
- 7260 people visited Bridgend food bank last year 1796 were children.

Instead of feeling worried or sad about this we decided to and put our faith into action by organising a whole school Foodbank collection. We know how generous our school community is and we weren't let down. As a school we collected approximately 200kg of dried and tinned foods for people in need in our area! We will walk to Aberkenfig Foodbank to deliver all the donations and meet the lovely people who volunteer there.

We'd like to pass on a huge DIOLCH YN FAWR PAWB to everyone!

We have also had great fun looking at castle art and found the work of Paul Klee. Our favourite piece is called 'Castle in the Sun.' It is a piece of abstract art using the Cubism technique. Paul Klee used a warm/hot palette. We experimented with warm and cold palettes and different mediums to make our own castle art after researching the features of medieval castles.

We also really enjoyed our Shocktober visit from the South Wales Ambulance Service where we learned all about the emergency services and when to call them. We also learnt how to put someone in to the recovery position – ask us about flamingos!





Dosbarth Coed-

Dosbarth Coed have had a very busy lead up to the half term holidays! We had a visit from a team of Community first responders where we learnt a great deal about CPR and how to call for help and act in an emergency. We really enjoyed the visit and learnt valuable life skills. We have also been lucky enough to participate in Osprey rugby sessions over the past few weeks and have loved learning fun new skills and games with Charlie from the Ospreys. This week, along with our usual learning in class we have celebrated the end of our topic - The Ancient Maya civilization. We completed a workshop of activities focusing on different aspects of our topic and showcased our learning in the form of iMovies and PowerPoint information presentations! We have learnt a great deal about this ancient time period and have thoroughly enjoyed the topic!





Dosbarth Mynydd-

We have been working hard on our final commission for our topic, Blowin' in the Wind. We have worked together in groups to make a model of an eco-friendly home. We then created a PowerPoint presentation about our home and shared this with our client, Jo from Cenin Renewables. Not only was she really impressed with our designs and our knowledge of how we can make our homes more sustainable and better for the environment, she was also impressed with how

we spoke and our ICT skills! We have also been using our literacy skills to write arguments for or against more wind farms being built in Wales. We have really enjoyed this topic as we have been able to build on our previous knowledge on climate change! We are now very much looking forward to a well-deserved break!
