

DEST and Hands on Literacy

- Dyslexia Early Screen test completed with children when they are 4 years and 6 months;
- Once all have been assessed those children identified as at risk are placed in a small group and receive Hands On Literacy intervention.
- HoL—4 x 15 minutes for 12 weeks;
- At the end of this children are reassessed to see if they have made further progress or need further intervention.

Precision Teaching

- This can focus on the needs of the child e.g. learning times tables, spelling, reading high frequency words)
- Pupils are identified through teacher nomination and pupil needs;
- Pupils have 2 x 10 minute sessions per week for the academic year.

Speech Links and Language Links

- Screening for speech and sound and understanding of language takes place in reception class;
- Following on from this a program is devised for those identified.
- Speech Links program—focus is on target sounds the children do now know;
- Language Links program—focus is on understanding;
- Length of intervention dependent on needs of the child;
- Post intervention testing takes place to measure progress.
- Language Links screening also takes place in Y4.

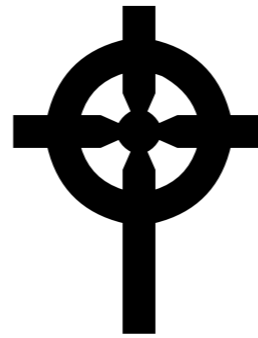
Interventions to support wellbeing

ELSA

One session per week for various durations (dependent on the needs of the child) to support emotional need.

Interventions

WELLCOMM

- Wellcomm screening takes place in Nursery.
- Pupils identified receive intervention and will be screened again after a term.
- Data is shared with the communication team at BCBC.
- Wellcomm screening also takes place in year 3 and year 5.

Catch Up Literacy and Numeracy

- 2 x 15 minute sessions a week for one year—about 35 sessions annually;
- Pupils are assessed at the start and the end of the assessment;
- Tracked using a tracker and are tracked during their following years in the school;
- Parents are provided with leaflets and sessions are modelled for them;
- Pupils eligible- Catch Up Literacy—Those who have just come off Language Support, those with a reading age between 6-18 months behind, those with a SS on WNT of 85-95, those at risk of not achieving a Level 4 at the end of KS2, teacher/parental nomination;
- Pupils eligible—Catch Up Numeracy—teacher/parental nomination, those with a SS on the WNT Numeracy Procedural of 85-95, those at risk of not achieving a Level 4 at the end of KS2.
- Cost of the Intervention—£190 per child per year.
- Two LSOs have completed at 3 levels of training for Catch Up Literacy and Numeracy
- School have achieved the Catch Up Silver Award April 2021
